Tito Dalmau portrays Rajasthan

• Espai Volart, the Barcelona branch of Fundació Vila Casas, shows the stunning photographs of Tito Dalmau, born in Barcelona in 1943. The images are the fruits of the architect and photographer's extensive stay in the Indian state of Rajasthan.

Located in the north west of India, on the border with Pakistan, Rajasthan is the largest state in India, although most of it is covered by the barren Thar Desert.

This is the latest in a series of Dalmau's photographic explorations focusing on the ideal and practise of travelling. Hundreds

of images are on show, setting scenes in characterful cities Jaipur, Pushkar, Jodhpur and Bundi, among others.

Dalmau's vision is diverse, from architectural subjects to natural and social themes, he explores the customs and culture of the people of Rajasthan, as they go about their daily busi-

Rich, colourful images, like vivid personal snap shots, they are full of life and movement. Naturality is important to Dalmau, "I didn't want anyone to notice my presence" he says "for they would then adopt unnatural poses."

Harun Farocki at Angels gallery

 Gallery Àngels-Barcelona presents 2 installations by Harun Farocki, acclaimed Czech-born, Berlin-based artist and cinematographer. Farocki investigates themes such as consumerism, war, the politics of the image, the possibilities of editing, constituting, in the words of the critic Thomas Elsaesser, "a constant dialogue with images, with image making, and with the institutions that produce and circulate these images." On Construction of Griffith's Films (2006) and Contre-Chant (2005) are each composed of two synchronised projections which make use of found footage, edited in order to produce a re-constructed reality. Farocki uses video-installation to deconstruct film, questioning the use of images and the position of the spectator. www.angelsbarcelona.com

The stark reality of Alberto Garcia-Alix

 Prestigious photographer Alberto Garcia-Alix, born in León in 1956, shows his work at gallery Carles Tachè (C/Consell de Cent 290). The foremost photographer to emerge from La Movida, centred in Madrid in the 1980s, his black and white images are defiant, stark, seedy and stylish, his aim is to depict life in as "pure" a way as possible.
